

# POL 111 Political Party Report

### **Introduction**

In my POL 111 (Intro to United States politics) class, we were given information and lectured on political parties and how they relate and are implemented in our current political system. After discussing and giving us information pertaining to political parties in the United States, we were given an index of current and active political parties in the US and had to choose three to research and answer questions about. To do this I chose one political party that I normally side with, found a party that I usually disagree with, and one that I generally have no opinion about. Those parties were the Democratic National Committee, the Republican National Committee, and the Libertarian party, respectfully. I used research skills learned through my HONR 201 course to complete this assignment.

### **What I did**

During this assignment, I was tasked to write roughly 500 words on each political party regarding their key issues and how they got out their vote. In doing this, I had to learn how to use primary sources to get the facts on each party and what they represent. I also learned to bring together factual information in a very polarized subject area. I started from primary sources on each party's websites, and cross referenced that information from other websites such as news sources and articles. One of the main ways I went about doing this was to research claims about certain parties. If the DNC made a claim regarding the diversity of their elected officials, I would be able to look that up in online encyclopedias.

That helped me generate a report on each political party to the best of my ability from credible websites and articles. This task is hard given the current political climate and mass amounts of misinformation. For each party, I discussed what I knew about them, key issues and people within the party, issues they put at the forefront of their to-do list, and how they effectively communicated their message and swayed voters to vote for them. The methodology I used to determine which issues I would talk about in the paper, was mostly
